


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
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What is the **PROBLEM?**

Academic Confidence


The BHS Method™ is carried out by teachers and administrators who all have the BHS Spark which means "10 out of 10" in quality. Due to smaller class sizes, students feel seen and everyone gets the chance to develop their voice.

The BHS Method™ emphasizes critical thinking. In turn, students feel confident discussing and giving their opinion on what they are learning.

The BHS Method™ guides students to the possibilities around them. By asking questions, teachers encourage students to challenge their held beliefs and consider other points of view.

Students have access to a learning platform where they can interact with the class content pre- and post- class. This gives students independence to deepen their knowledge on their own terms. BHS shares the tools to empower students in their learning.

Our world is constantly changing, and the BHS Method™ acknowledges that the program of study should be malleable. The method wants to foster adaptable students that will be able to handle their journeys after they graduate. Social Integration

School Clubs

The BHS Method™ cultivates the growth of well-rounded students so education is extended far beyond the classroom. Clubs are offered after school weekly.

These include the board game club, the volleyball club, the music production club, and the debate club. These clubs serve as groundwork to foster deeper connections, motivated by shared interests.

Student Voice

The BHS Method™ invites students to become involved in their learning journey. Student body representatives actively obtain student's feedback and communicate suggestions to the staff.

Through this method, activities such as 'Movie Night' and 'Ski Week' can be proposed and enacted upon.



Language Integration

As English is the main language spoken at the school, English lessons are provided for international students.

Emotional Intelligence

Harmony

Students' lives outside of school are encouraged and valued. For example, athletes' schedules can be modified to fit with their training schedule.

Communication Skills

The BHS Method™ acknowledges the importance of fostering emotional intelligence in students. By modeling compassion, teachers create a relationship of care.

At school, students are led to a point where they feel confident to ask for help, collaborate with peers and even negotiate their assignments. They naturally learn conflict resolution, communication strategies, and other life skills that they can apply in their own relationships.

Curiosity& Self-Confidence

By sparking curiosity in students, they learn to be motivated by interest and not by grades or what question will be on the final exam. These skills can be applied later on when they are choosing a career, as they will be confident to make decisions based on their passions.



Mental Health Support

The BHS Method™ recognizes the importance of students' mental health. To support students, the school has a qualified counselor on staff.

Counseling is never forced upon students, yet the counselor forms connections with the students by establishing a presence in the community. This method means that students can feel supported and feel like someone has their back.

The BHS Method™ also offers a health elective. In this class, students learn strategies to balance their life. They learn how to manage stress, to put a name to what they are feeling and to listen to their bodies.

Sometimes students don't know how to word what is affecting them, but this elective empowers them to acknowledge what they are feeling and seek support.

Overall, the school cultivates an atmosphere where students feel at home. Everyone involved in the community has a meaningful role, which creates a sense of purpose. Accordingly, the emergent property becomes a harmonious family environment.



O5 Open Community
